

Marine Sheriff Patrol

Jason Broekstra spoke about the concerns of Milfoil, collected samples and sent to lab-recovery results should hit target dosages. Native plants doing well, water clarity good, lake is doing well. Weed control budget was set at \$20,000.00-\$35,000.00 to date we have spent \$22,000.00.Surveying next year, managing Milfoil and Pondweed, additional algae treatment as needed. Sherrill Houser spoke of the PWC watercraft rules, and people harassing wildlife: swans, ducks, Loons. Spoke of the slow no wake rules, Alcohol and boating issues, inland lakes speed is 55mph.


